| May Senate<br>Meeting Date  | The Committee agreed to move the May Senate meeting from 12 May to 19 May 2021 so as to give the faculties more time to consider candidates for degrees and faculty members more time to submit final grades. The Clerk will work to move the May Agenda Committee meeting back accordingly. The Committee discussed if moving it back to May 26 <sup>th</sup> may be needed. | Consideration of<br>the Rule on Roll<br>Call Votes  | The Clerk noted that 9 senators had written regarding the increased use of "roll call" votes at Senate. He noted that most of those comments expressed the view that its selective use was an issue. The Chair suggested that this could be something considered during a triennial review, but that his initial view was we should make all votes roll called as a way of being transparent. Members discussed the logistical issues with roll call votes, and possible technological solutions. The clerk advised that it took roughly 5 minutes to sort out each vote. The Committee decided to consider a rule change at their next meeting and then distribute it to Senators for consultation before making a final recommendation to Senate. |
