However, due to limited enrolment, a higher R-score is required for most programs. The Cote De Rendement (R-Score) may be used as a supplement for admission. Students are strongly encouraged to submit their R-Score. Transfer credit for up to one full year of degree study may be granted when the two-year diploma has been awarded.
